SESSION TYPES

Keynote Address

All Keynotes will be in take place in the Marula Hall

Group Panel Discussions

The group panel discussions with small group of experts chaired by a moderator, the attendees will be invited to ask questions during the session.

Campfire Sessions

A presentation from a speaker, it then focuses on gaining key audience participation. The presenter turns facilitator allowing attendees to answer questions and provide comments.

TED Talks

TED-style talks are 10 minutes with or without a slide presentation, the talks are personal, about a topic the speaker is knowledgeable about and feels deeply passionate about.

Kijiwani Talks

These talks are held under the tree, where presenters are provided 5 to 7 minutes to share their experience in working in conservation.

Kitimoto Talk

Kitimoto (the hot seat) sessions serve as a platform for discussing broad questions that require diverse viewpoints and debating.

WildWild Vision

Talks, films and media are all held in a mini-cinema.
